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English: Writing	English: Reading	Maths	
We will read Nelson Mandela's 'Long Walk to Freedom' and use the text as a starting point to write a biography of the famous leader. Next, we will move onto suspense stories, reading 'The Wedding Ghost' and 'The Wolves in the Walls' to look at how tension and suspense are created in stories. We will finish the term by writing recounts.	As part of Destination Reader lessons, we will use a range of fiction, non-fiction and poetry text to help us practice skills of Predicting, Questioning, Clarifying, Summarising, Inferring and Evaluating. Children will also use Accelerated Reader to track their progress with their own reading books.	This term we will be looking at Fractions, revising equivalent fractions and working on adding, subtracting, multiplying and dividing fractions and mixed numbers. Then, we will move on to converting units of measurement.	
Science	Geography	Religious Education (RE)	
Our topic this term is Light. We will learn about how we see, shadows, reflection and refraction, how light travels and how this enables us to see objects. The children will have the opportunity to make their own functioning periscope, finding out about mirrors and the angles of reflection and incidence.	Our Geography enquiry question is 'Why does population change?' We will be able to identify densely and sparsely populated areas of the world and describe the increase in global population over time. We will investigate migration, push and pull factors, and be able to explain why some people have to leave their homes. Finally, we will look at how to improve an environment.	In RE we will be exploring the religions and world views of Christians, Muslims and Hindus with the question 'What difference does it make to believe in Ahimsa (harmlessness), Grace, and Ummah (community)?	
French	Music	Art/ Design and Technology	
Our topic in French is 'French Football Champions'. We will learn vocabulary related to football through a variety of language-learning techniques and use our language detective skills to decode French football player profiles.	Our Music unit, 'Theme and Variations' will allow children to explore the musical concept of theme and variations and discover how rhythms can 'translate' onto different instruments.	In our Art lessons we will look at developing photogr4aphy skills and techniques to design a range of creative photographic outcomes. In DT, we will design and make a navigation tool to produce a multifunctional device for trekkers using CAD 3D modelling software.	
Physical Education (PE)	Computing	Personal, Social and Health Education (PSHE)	
We will be working with Elite Sports during our PE lessons each Thursday.	Our unit on website creation will introduce children to the creation of websites for a chosen purpose. Children will identify what makes a good web page and use this information to design and evaluate their own website using Google Sites.	Our unit on Celebrating Difference will allow children to discuss what the term 'normal' means, and celebrate our unique identities.
