TIPS FOR PARENTS AND CARERS: Online Safety – Let's Talk About It! This week we are thinking online bullying. Online bullying, also known as cyberbullying, is when someone uses technology such as phones, games, or social media to upset, harm, or intimidate another

person. It can include sending unkind messages, sharing embarrassing images, or excluding others online. Unlike face-to-face situations, online bullying can happen at any time and can feel harder for children to escape. As parents, it is important to talk regularly with your child about their online experiences so they feel comfortable sharing any concerns early.
