TAG DAYS AND SUMMER FESTIVAL

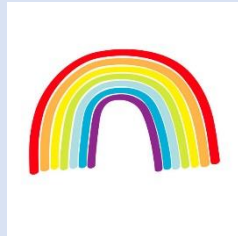
As we approach summer and our Summer Festival on Saturday 4th July, we are now in the middle of planning events to help towards the day. We will be holding 2 tag days to help.

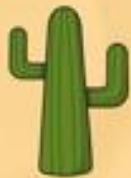
